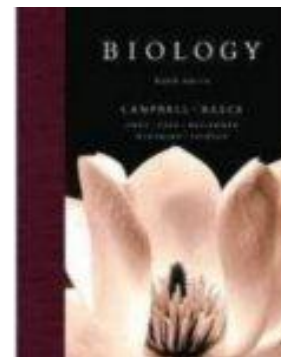


## BIOLOGY AP – Ms Buser

Keep up with your reading, listen carefully in class, take notes, study for all exams, and come for extra help as needed. **It is assumed that you have done your reading before you come to class and are prepared to discuss topics, ask, and answer questions.** Additionally, it is recommended that you use the study disc in the back of your text and do all concept check questions within the chapters and the self quiz at the end of the chapters. If you cannot answer these questions, it means you need to go back over the material (the answers are in the Appendix-use it).

### 1) Obtain textbook

- a) *Biology*, 8th ed by Campbell and Reece
  - i) Pick up a text book from Ms. Buser BEFORE you leave for the summer.
  - ii) Some textbooks will be placed in the KHS guidance Office

### 2) Read the following chapters

- a) Chapters 26 and 23,
- b) Chapters 22 and 24
- c) Chapters 29 and 30

### 3) For EACH chapter

- a) Answer ALL the following categories of questions at the end of each chapter (see gold highlighted boxes).
  - i) Evolution Connection
  - ii) Scientific Inquiry
  - iii) Science, Technology and Society

### 4) Format

- a) All work must be typed
- b) Answer using complete sentences

### 5) Due Date

- a) First day of school, September 6, 2011
- b) Late work will not be accepted and will earn no points
- c) If you are absent, see Ms Buser as soon as you return

### 6) Grading

- a) Question responses will be graded as a non-test assignment and included in the Marking Period 1 average

### 7) Other

- a) This schedule does not include lab day. On that day, we will do a lab.
- b) It will fall so there will **only be one exam in a given week.**
  - i) The first class block will be a review of chapters 26 and 23.
  - ii) The second class will be an exam on chapters 26 and 23.

- vi) The sixth class will be an exam on chapters 29 and 30
