Agenda item #1 represents the Facilities Committee's recommendation.

1. Be it resolved, that the Kinnelon Board of Education approve fees, not to exceed \$12,500, for an **engineering report** for the Borough of Kinnelon to determine overall cost for the installation of an artificial turf field at Kinnelon High School.

Discussion:

- Mrs. DeAlessi commented that she has concerns about budget constraints
- Mr. Petruccelli commented that athletics are part of the school experience
- Dr. Fink commented that he is now aware that our own students cannot use the field.
- Mr. Davin commented that weather conditions in the spring determine use of the field. A turf field would increase usage by 20X-30X. Sports involvement helps students get into college.
- Since the property belongs to the school, the town cannot pay for the study according to statute. Prior studies were performed by engineers no longer in business.
- Mr. Rosenberg, Assistant Principal for Athletics, spoke regarding the
 conditions of the field being unplayable at the end of the season.
 He spoke about the costs of sending our teams to other fields when
 our field cannot be used. Most schools in our Conference have turf
 fields. The costs to maintain the field would be shared with the town
 and the town has offered to allow the schools to use the rental fees
 to cover the cost of the engineering report. Everyone would benefit.
